Save San Diego High School - Vote Yes on Measure I in November

San Diego High has been serving San Diego for more than 130 years and is a cherished part of the city's history. Measure I will maintain a longstanding partnership between San Diego Unified School District and the City of San Diego for the shared use of public property. Vote yes on Measure I to ensure San Diego High stays on the site it has occupied since 1882, allowing students to continue learning without disruption. A No Vote will displace over 2000 students who will be forced to leave their neighborhood school, and will cost taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars to construct an alternative high school.

Elementary School Highlights and Messages:

Drop Off and Pick up Tips

- Park and Walk (it usually really does take less time)
- Drop off early. Running club starts around 7:45 so kids can get some exercise
- Arrange with your 3rd-5th grader to be picked up in the front (it is less congested)
- Let kindergarten families pick up from 2:30-2:45. Grades 1-5 will not be down till 2:45
- Avoid tickets: Do not leave your vehicle unattended in loading zones, make U-turns, or double park (especially near the Ash and Fern Street corner across from the church).
- Use name cards: Please include your child's first and last name, teachers, and classes and place on dashboard for pick up.

Names on Items

Please write first and last names on all your child's belongings including jackets, sweaters, lunch bags, backpacks, and water bottles. Our lost and found is already getting full with these items.

Lunch Payment Clarification

The Elementary School uses the San Diego Unified School District food services. At the start of the school year, you may have received an email regarding balances left for your child's 2015-2016 lunch accounts. If your child owed money to the District food services in June, the District required AEA to pay that balance for you and we then asked to be reimbursed through RevTrak. We are still accepting those payments. **However, 2016-2017 is a new year and you will need to pay through the District directly moving forward,** and not through our RevTrak system. We are working with them to find a better way to communicate with families during the school should your balance start to rise. You can log on anytime to find you balances on PAYPAMS.

District Lunch Payment Options

ALL families are asked to complete the School Lunch Form regardless of whether or not you think you will qualify for Free or Reduced lunches. This can be done online or via hardcopy and remains confidential. You may have received a hard copy from the district already. Please either send that back asap or complete the application on the district website. Only one application per family is necessary.
