On the topic of being busy, while I understand the urgency of our professional and personal lives, this should never be an excuse to be rude or endanger others. On both AEA campuses it is critical that all members of our community realize that our student drop-off and pick-up procedures are in place for the sole purpose of protecting students and ensuring they leave campus in an orderly manner. AEA staff assigned to support these processes are not law enforcement officers nor traffic experts, but rather your children's teachers and support staff. I appreciate those members of our community who make a concerted effort to be patient when there is traffic and to follow the direction of our staff.

Here are a few tips that might help lower stress at drop-off and pick-up on both AEA campuses:

- In the mornings consider leaving home ten minutes earlier to account for traffic and delays at our campuses. This can go a long way towards decreasing stress levels.*
- At pick-up consider parking a few blocks away from campus and walking to meet your child. In addition to getting some fresh air this eliminates the need to sit in lines of traffic and is also kind to the environment.*
- The West side of the AEACMS campus (by the ball courts with alley entrance) is under-utilized as a pick-up area. This means that the East side of campus (26th Street) is a stressful traffic jam on a daily basis. Middle school students are capable of walking down to the ball courts to be picked up and may actually enjoy chatting with friends as they go.*

Please join the AEA community for a film screening of Screenagers: Growing Up in the Digital Age on Tuesday October 3, 2017 from 5:30 to 7:30pm. Film screening will be held at the Middle School campus in the MPR. Directed by Delaney Ruston, M.D., this film explores the impact of screen time on children and offers solutions on how we can help children find balance. In addition, Screenagers discusses how families can minimize harmful effects of screen time. After seeing the film, people report they feel more confident and better equipped to establish balance around screen time. Families can bring their students ages 10 and up to see the film. About the film maker: Dr. Ruston decided to make Screenagers when she found herself constantly struggling with her own two children about screen time. This is depicted along with many other stories in Screenagers. The runtime for the film is 68 minutes. A discussion about the film will follow the screening. This event is open to all families, K-8.

School Attendance:

Each year we make school attendance a priority. We monitor attendance closely because research has shown that regular attendance is vital for the success of your children. We are asking all parents to help us ensure the regular, on-time attendance of their children at school. Please

remember school starts promptly at 8:10 and a late arrival is disruptive to your child's learning as well as distracts the entire class. In addition, we ask that all vacations and travel be scheduled around the AEA school calendar. AEA offers extended winter and spring breaks compared to other schools to accommodate for travel.

We know students get sick and we certainly don't want sick children coming to school. If you have a sick child, you may ask about an independent contract in the front office so your child can keep up with academics if they are able. With the flu season approaching, The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) strongly recommends a flu vaccine each fall for everyone 6 months of age and older.

Getting vaccinated is easy:

- Contact your doctor, clinic, or pharmacy, and ask if they stock flu vaccine.

Pick-Up:

Thank you to all the parents who are honoring the staggered pick-up times. This has greatly improved our traffic flow to the neighborhood. Please remember: (Mon, Tues, Thurs, Fri)

- Kindergarten: 2:30pm
- Grades 1 and 2: 2:40pm
- Grades 3-5: 2:50pm

You will be asked to leave the line if you are too early for your child's pick up to allow for a steady flow of traffic. And don't forget the placards with your child's name, grade, and teachers. This helps us tremendously.

Cell Phones and Smart Watches:

Please be reminded that cell phones must be turned off and left in backpacks during the school day and only used with permission by an adult while on campus. This holds true for Smart Watches as well. Students should not be using their watches to text during the school day. Anyone caught playing games, texting, or taking pictures during the school day will have their devices confiscated and they will need to be picked up by a parent in the front office.
