Crazy Sock Day: November 17th



Middle School Highlights and Messages:

Safe School Ambassadors

Last Thursday and Friday, 24 students (6th-8th) were trained to be Safe School Ambassadors for this school year. The Safe School Ambassadors program uses an "inside out" approach to reduce bullying and mistreatment on campus. We recognize that students are very influential with their peers. They play a key role in establishing the emotional climate and shaping the behavioral norms on a school campus. In addition, students know what is going on behind the scenes in school; they often know who needs help, who is angry, sad or hurting, and who is being left out. The Safe School Ambassadors program harnesses the power of positive student influence to reduce bullying and mistreatment to make our campus a more safe and nurturing place, where we can maintain high student achievement. The students learned what actions to take whenever they noticed mistreatment on campus (i.e. exclusion, put-downs, intimidation, unwanted physical contact, or acts against campus).





Lantern Festival Volunteer Opportunity

It's that time of year again to start coordinating volunteers for the Lantern Festival taking place on Saturday November 4th. Here are some examples of the duties for the Middle School volunteers:

- Before the event: decorate and set up prior to the event (2-4pm); set-up includes covering all tables with paper, setting up easels, signs and tables
- During the event: support adult volunteers at the volunteer table to sell lantern sticks and candles, provide support for food and trash services, serve drinks and dessert, carol during the Lantern Parade, possibly provide support in breaking down the event
